- ▶ - To **advise** Government on the formulation of a comprehensive policy for the elderly including matters relating to the care, housing, financial security, health and medical, psychological, employment and recreational needs of the elderly;
- ▶ - To **co-ordinate** the planning and development of various programmes and services for the elderly, and to recommend priorities for implementation having regard to manpower, financial and other resources available; and
- ▶ - To **monitor** implementation of policies and programmes affecting the elderly, and to make recommendations to Government to ensure that agreed objectives are met.

8. - Fostering partnerships and collaboration among the government, healthcare providers, social services, and the community to deliver comprehensive and integrated care.
9. - Encouraging active aging, lifelong learning, and social engagement to enhance the overall well-being and independence of the elderly.

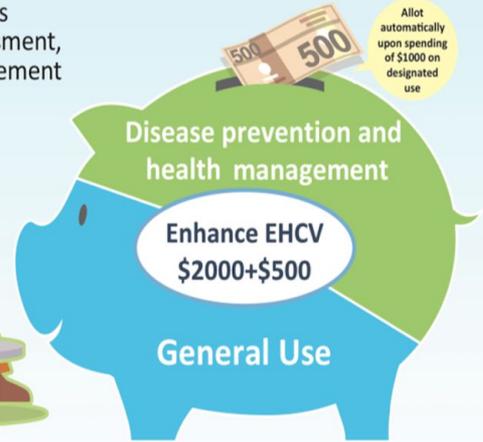
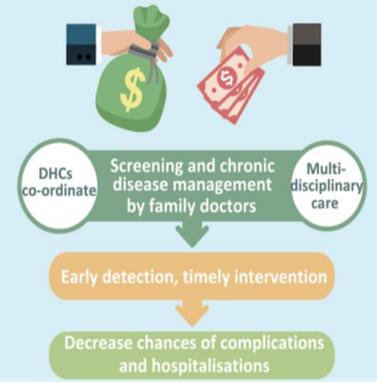

Primary Healthcare Improves my Health

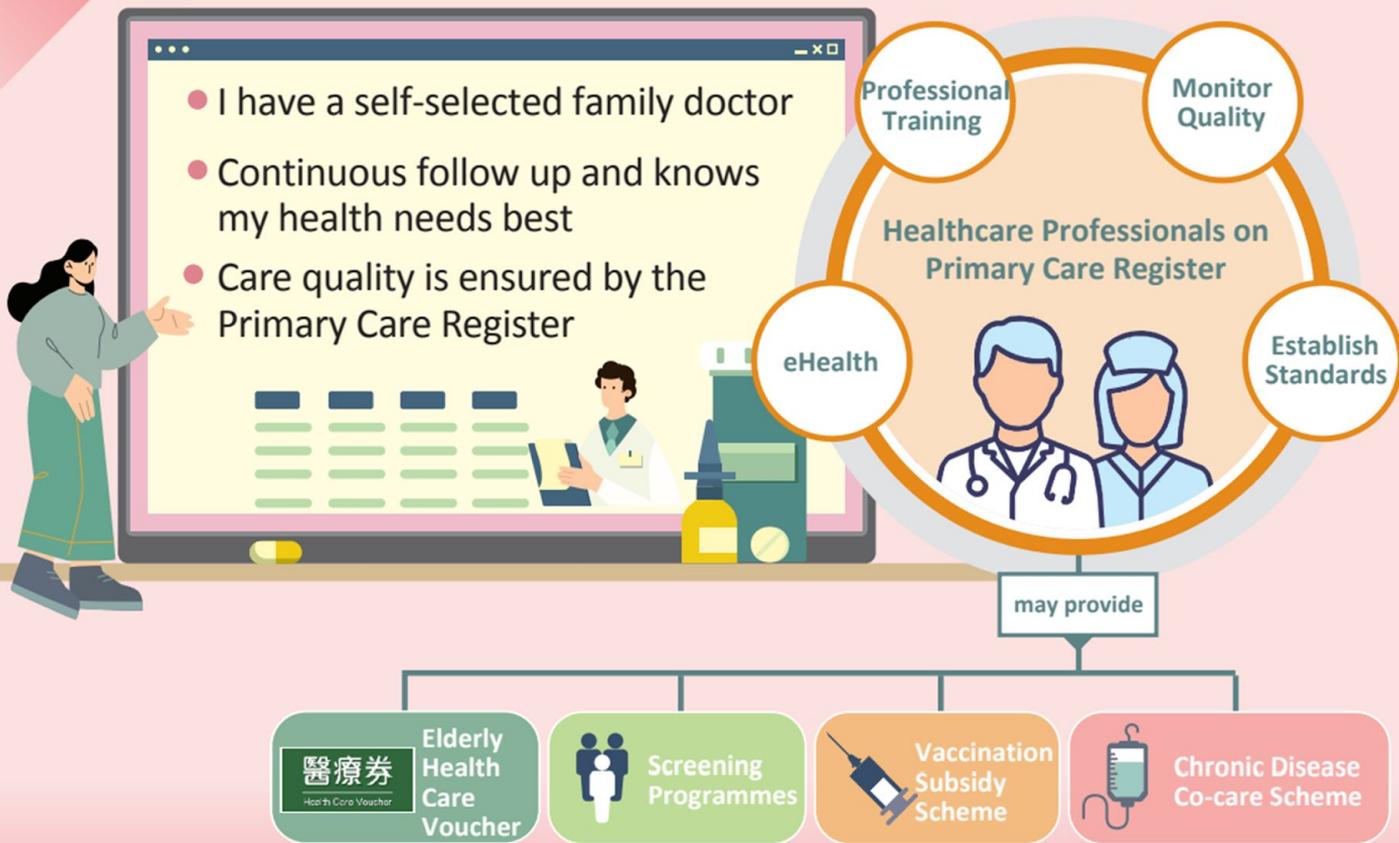
Early Detection, Timely Intervention

2018

\$ 1 billion I & T Fund established: service units can procure, rent or trial technology products

2023

Eligible seniors can rent assistive technology products through **Community Care Service Voucher**

2024-25

Inject additional \$1 billion into the I&T Fund and **expand its scope** to cover gerontechnology products **suitable for household use**



Enhancing digital literacy trainings for the elderly

- ▶ - Expanded the service scope of more than 210 subvented elderly centres to include the promotion of gerontechnology
- ▶ - Elderly centres organise different activities to keep the elderly abreast of digital technology

BUILDING ECOSYSTEMS OFFERING COMPREHENSIVE SERVICES

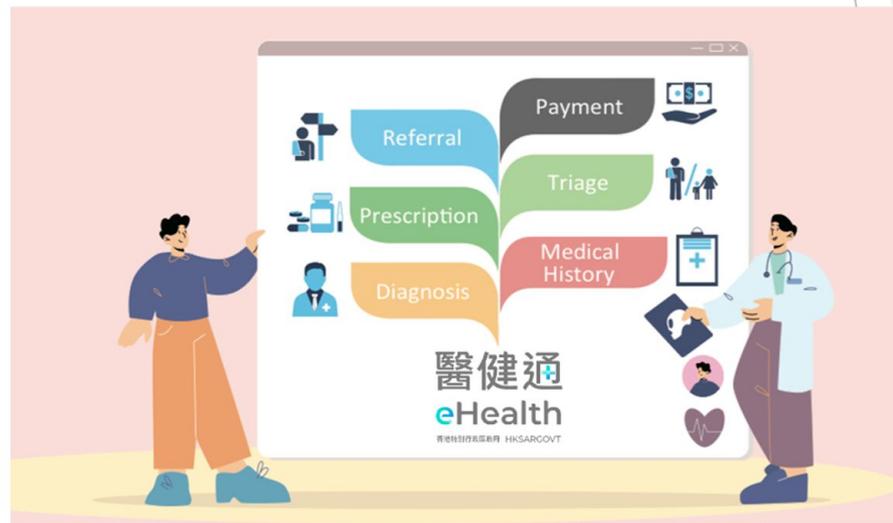
Advances in technology can impact on the provision of online healthcare, providing solutions to present difficulties and challenges.

Technology can provide solutions by aiding doctors in making better diagnoses at a distance and have proven valuable during the COVID19 epidemic .

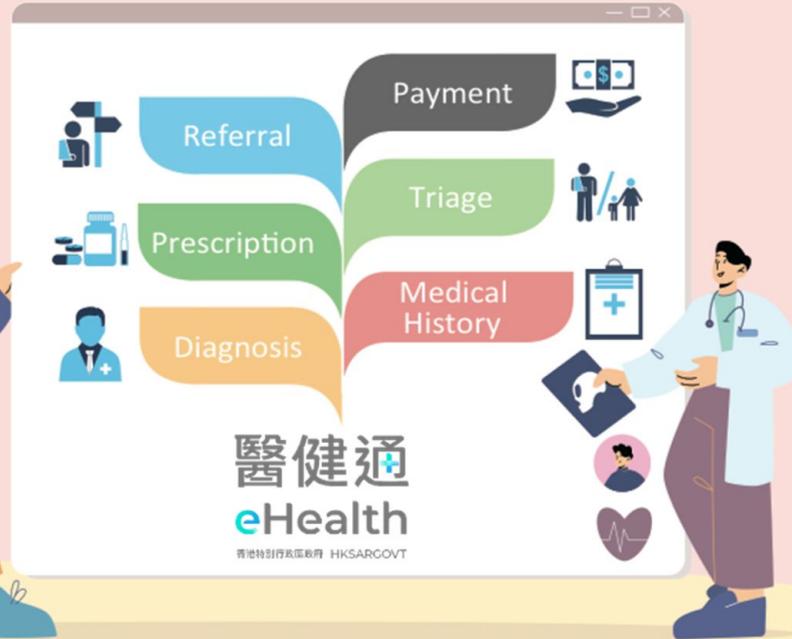
