What we know about healthcare

Complexity- rapidly evolving and dynamic to meet users/customer needs

Diverse population health and needs- ageing and significant co-morbidity

Diverse workforce-specialty and expertise

Proliferation in innovative solutions

Workforce issues- globally ; brain drain vs brain gain

But also.....

- Healthcare is cultural; varies by location and context
- Healthcare is local but health is global
- Quality is often a reflection of a nation's values
- No one size fits all approach
- Solutions are as diverse as the world itself

Study Aim

The primary aim of this research is to investigate the role of leadership in fostering innovation within healthcare organizations. Specifically, the study seeks to:

- Identify key leadership qualities that support the implementation of innovative practices in healthcare.
- Explore the organizational factors that facilitate or hinder innovation in healthcare settings
- Provide some insight to inform policy/practice

Case Study of 5 Organisations (2 English, 1 Scottish, 1 Irish and 1 Welsh)



Qualitative Studies; Semi-structured Interviews and discussions



Purposive sample



The sample included 75 participants; comprising senior executives (CEOs), senior leaders, mid-level managers, and frontline healthcare workers.



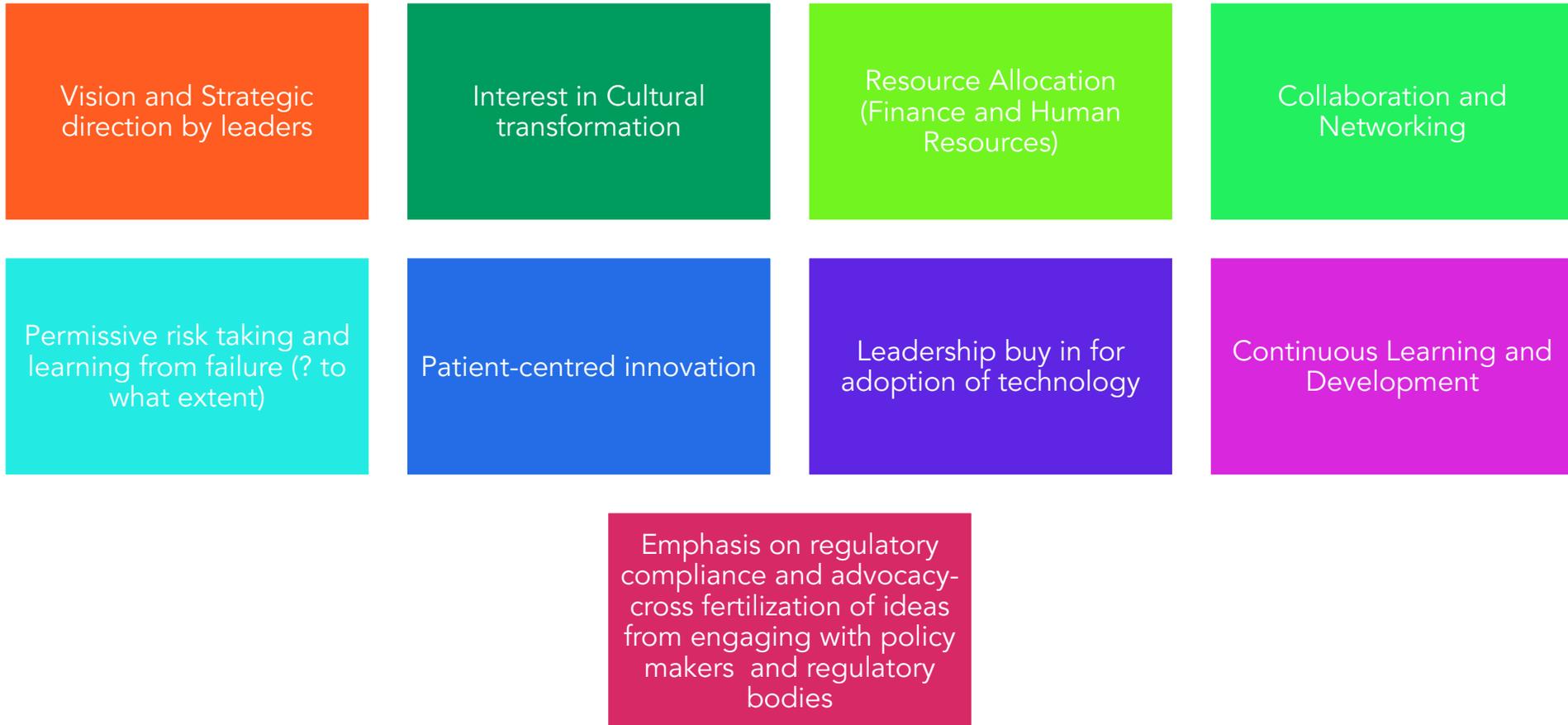
Interviews over a 6 week period; interviewing, observing online meetings and attending group events to discuss



Thematic Data Analysis; identification of patterns and themes

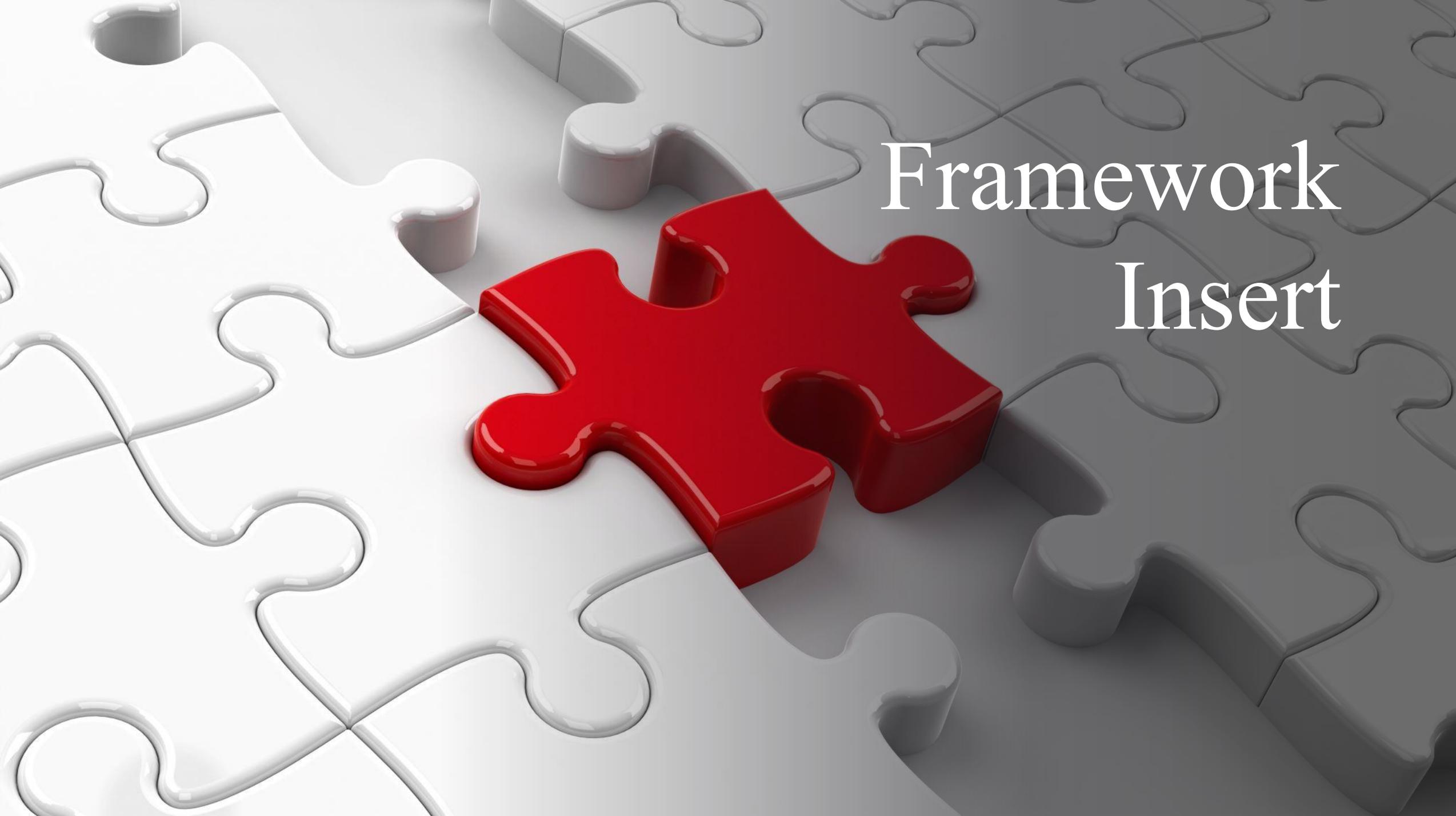

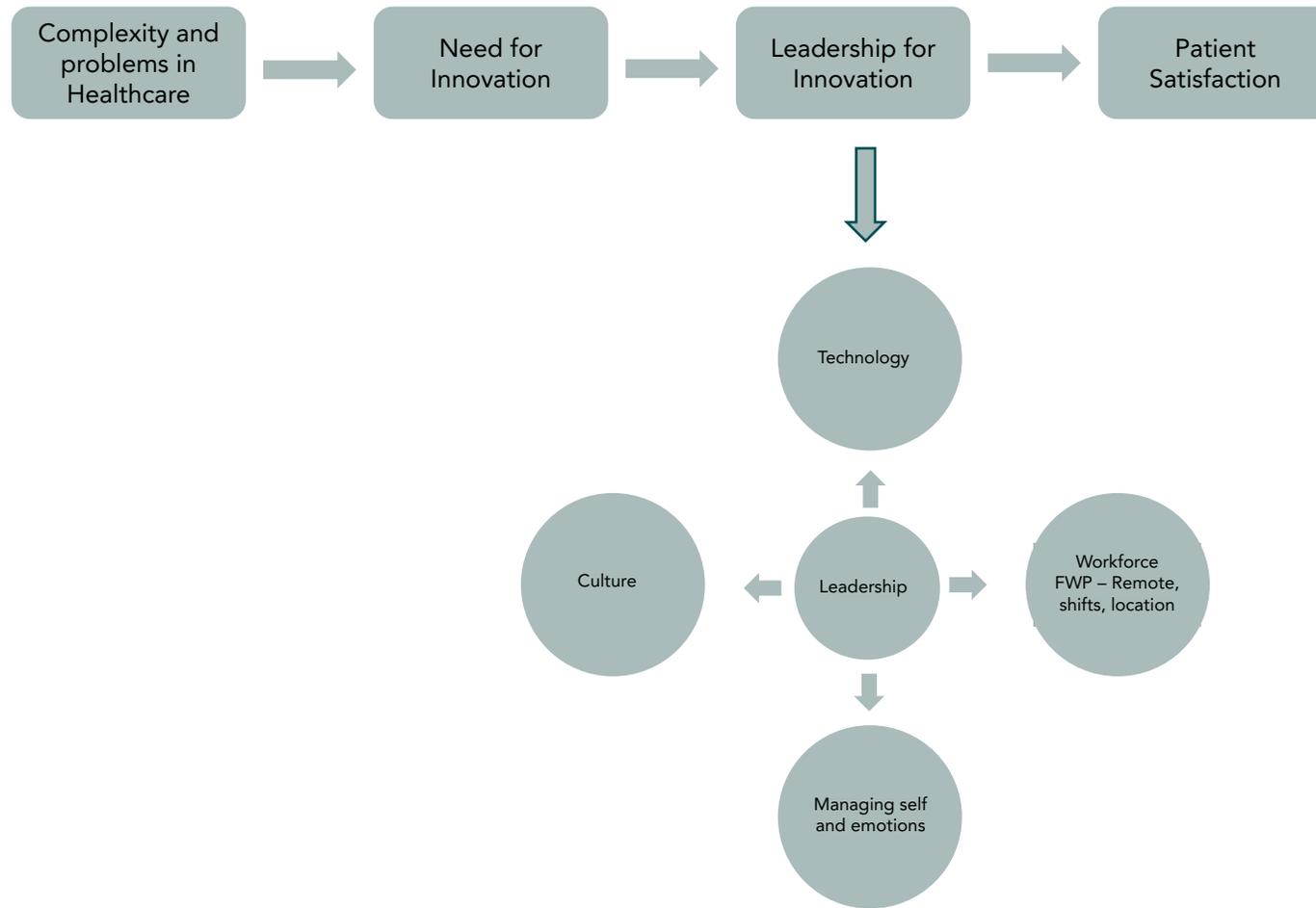


Figure 1-Contextual framework of leadership in innovation

Highlights



The healthcare system thrives on leadership with fosters innovation, often with the following:



Concern for the people- users or customers



Allowing out of the box thinking



Allows risk taking- but how much in healthcare?



Fosters and culture that values employees- recognising expertise in teamworking



Psychological safety for all involved



Recognition and rewards for innovative and collaborative solutions

Transformation Leadership

- Occurs frequently in healthcare and requires:
 - Emotional Intelligence
 - Creating the right culture/atmosphere
 - Does not care who gets the credit- do not feel threatened
 - Empowering others in the workforce to thrive and take the initiative in problem solving
 - Managing self, people, processes and organisations

Innovation in healthcare is crucial for improving patient outcomes, enhancing operational efficiency, and addressing the evolving challenges in the industry.
